National Player of the Year Candidate

Career Notes

- A National Player of the Year and first team All-America candidate
- A team captain, along with fellow senior Nolan Smith, in 2010-11 ... widely regarded as one of the hardest working players in the country ... an emerging vocal leader for the Blue Devils
- Highly skilled offensive player with the ability to score on the block or from the perimeter ... one of the top inside-outside threats in the country
- A fluid athlete with an advanced and well-rounded skill set ... has the ability to lead the team in nearly every statistical category
- Averaging 15.9 points, 6.9 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.2 steals per game ... has started 110 of 111 career games, including 68 straight to open his college career
- Ranks 18th at Duke with 1,767 points ... his 1,767 points are the third-most by a junior in school history ... 233 points shy of becoming the 11th player at Duke to score 2,000 career points
- One of eight Duke players to score at least 600 points in two straight seasons ... looking to join Art Heyman and Christian Laettner as the only players in Duke history to top 600 points in three straight seasons
- Has 95 career double figure scoring games, including 32 games with 20 or more points and one 30-point game
- A strong rebounder on both ends of the court ... ranks 18th at Duke with 762 career rebounds ... also ranks sixth with 272 offensive rebounds ... the ninth Duke player with at least 700 rebounds by the end of his junior season
- Has 20 career double-doubles and 21 double figure rebounding games
- Ranks 11th at Duke with 205 career three-pointers ... became the 11th player in school history with 200 career made treys against West Virginia in the 2010 NCAA Tournament
- Poised and fearless performer when the game is on the line ... has hit several clutch baskets throughout his career
- Outstanding helpside defender ... has taken 36 charges in his career
- An avid artist ... designed a logo and t-shirt for teammates following Duke's 17-0 undefeated home season in 2009-10 ... has also designed covers for Blue Planet Magazine and a wall mural in the team lounge
- Active in Duke's award-winning Verizon Read with the Blue Devils, a community outreach reading program in the Durham school district
- Has also hosted the Kyle Singler Southern Oregon Open in Medford for the past four years with proceeds from the events benefitting Kids Unlimited

2009-10

- Named NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player after averaging 20.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game in wins over West Virginia and Butler ... also went 6-of-11 (.545) from three-point range at Lucas Oil Stadium
- Claimed ACC Tournament Most Valuable Player honors after leading Duke to wins over Virginia, Miami and Georgia Tech ... averaged 21.7 points, 8.3 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game, while shooting 50.0 percent (7-of-14) from three-point range for the tournament
- Also received first team All-ACC accolades
- Fifth team All-America pick by Sporting News ... NABC second team All-District II ... USBWA All-District III selection
- Started all 40 games, matching a Duke record for starts in a season ... averaged 17.7 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.4 assists, 0.8 blocks and 1.0 steals per game ... posted a .415 field goal percentage (228-of-550), including .399 from three-point range (85-of-213) ... also went 166-of-208 (.798) from the free throw line
- Finished second on the team in scoring, rebounds, field goals, three-point field goals and minutes ... led the team in three-point field goal percentage, blocks and double-doubles

- Ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring (17.7 ppg.), tied for 11th in rebounds (7.0 rpg.), seventh in free throw percentage (.798), second in three-point percentage (.399), tied for third in three-point field goals (2.1 3pg.) and third in minutes played (35.9 mpg.)
- Finished the year with 707 points, 16th-most in a season at Duke
- Led the team in scoring 17 times and in rebounds on 15 occasions
- Reached double figures in scoring in 36 games with 17 games of 20 or more points and one 30-point contest
- Made at least one three-pointer in 34 games with three or more three-point field goals on 15 occasions
- Recorded eight or more rebounds 19 times with eight double figure rebounding games
- Posted 19 points, nine rebounds, two assists, two blocks and one steal in the NCAA Championship game win over Butler (4/5)
- Finished with 21 points, nine rebounds and five assists against West Virginia (4/3) in the NCAA Final Four ... was 3-of-5 from three-point range
- Scored a game-high 24 points to go with eight rebounds and two steals in the NCAA Sweet 16 against Purdue (3/26) ... went 4-of-6 from three-point distance in the win
- Recorded a double-double with 22 points and 10 rebounds against Arkansas-Pine Bluff (3/19) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament
- Scored 20 points with a career-high 14-of-16 from the free throw line against Georgia Tech (3/14) in the ACC Championship game ... 14 free throws are tied for the most by a Duke player in an ACC Tournament game
- Tallied 27 points, eight rebounds and six assists against Miami (3/13) in the ACC Tournament semifinals ... made five three-pointers in the contest
- Notched 18 points and 11 rebounds against Virginia in the first round of the ACC Tournament (3/12)
- Tallied 25 points, 10 rebounds and two steals against Virginia Tech (2/21) ... made 4-of-9 three-point field goal attempts in the game
- Notched 22 points, 11 rebounds and four assists at Miami (2/17)
- Tied a school record for three-point field goal percentage with at least 10 attempts, shooting .800 (8-of-10) against No. 21 Georgia Tech (2/4) ... finished the game with a career-high 30 points as his eight treys were tied for third-most in a single game by a Duke player
- Posted a double-double with 21 points and 15 rebounds against Wake Forest (1/17)
- Scored 28 points, matching a career high with 10 made field goals and making 7-of-7 from the free throw line against Wisconsin (12/2)
- Recorded a double-double with 23 points and 11 rebounds against Coastal Carolina (11/16)

- First team ACC All-Tournament selection after averaging 18.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game ... played all 120 minutes of the tournament, becoming just the second Duke player to play three straight complete games in the tournament ... recorded nine blocks in the ACC Tournament, the fourth-most by a Duke player

- Led the team in offensive rebounds, defensive rebounds and blocks ... finished second in points, field goals, three-point field goals, three-point field goal percentage, steals and minutes played ... was also third in free throws and assists
