



This week, one of our favorite indie albums of the past decade, Deerhunter's *Halcyon Digest*, turns 10. Upon revisiting the album recently, we were struck by how much it felt like a classic alt-rock record, like Depeche Mode's *Violator* or Smashing Pumpkins' *Siamese Dream*, even more than an indie rock LP. First of all, it sounds amazing — sonically, it creates a world that draws you in. The whole package just feels very complete, right down to the album cover, as an experience. Deerhunter also seems like an actual band, especially at a time when “actual” bands seem in short supply in indie rock. So many of our favorite indie groups now — Tame Impala, The War On Drugs, Soccer Mommy, Car Seat Headrest, Snail Mail — feel like projects driven by one person. ## SUFJAN STEVENS




## MARY LATTIMORE


**'WRONG WAY UP' by
