When it comes to placing R.E.M. in the history of American indie music, it is impossible to be hyperbolic. They are simply one of the best and most important bands this country has ever produced. Not only did they make great albums — and they did this more frequently than nearly every other band of their generation — they invented the indie-band prototype that is still being propagated today, even by younger generations that might not have direct knowledge of their music. Beyond simply writing brilliant songs, R.E.M. is foundational in modern rock history. They wrote the book for this kind of music, and then rewrote it several more times. For my list of favorite R.E.M. songs, I tried my best to take in the full scope of R.E.M.'s 29-year recording career, from their modest beginnings in Athens, Georgia in the early '80s to their gradual indie fame in the late '80s, to their "imperial" period in the early '90s to their troubled but often rewarding post-Bill Berry period in the late '90s and beyond. There are so many great songs here! (As well as a fair number of songs I had to leave off. To quote Michael Stipe: I'm sorry!) Are we ready to explore 100 of R.E.M.'s best songs? Let's begin the begin right here.

NEIL YOUNG + CRAZY HORSE - 'WAY DOWN IN THE RUST BUCKET' (4LP)



After recording *Ragged Glory* at Broken Arrow Ranch in the spring of 1990 and releasing it that September, Neil Young and Crazy Horse took the stage at The Catalyst in Santa Cruz on November 13 to unleash the album upon a live audience. An epic live album spanning nearly three hours, *Way Down In The Rust Bucket* is #11.5 in Neil Young's Performance Series, and part of his

ongoing Archives project. We recently got our hands on this boxed set and it's pretty incredible.
