Here's an honest question: Does she have jams? What's a song of hers that's just an undeniable banger? Her records are very well put together but ... are they actually fun? Her music feels like it's mostly conceptual window dressing. Take her latest, *Daddy's Home*. If I was reviewing this album on paper, I'd be into it. Bowie, Sly Stone, '70s sleazy funk rock – I love all the music St. Vincent references. But as music that you have to eventually actually listen to, it's not as vibrant as it should be. This is something that I think is true of every St. Vincent album — they're immaculate sounding but it's almost too immaculate. It's a little airless and remote. Do you agree or am I off base? 
